HONORS KEEP COMING FOR FOOTBALL PROGRAM

Scecina Players Receive Individual Recognition

Jan. 27, 2011: Although the high school football season ended in November, individual honors for players continue to come.

Several Scecina Memorial High School players have been honored in the past two months.

Junior kicker/punter Ryan Frain took top honors as the 2012 Punting Champion in the 2010 Kornblue Kicking Challenge at FIU Stadium in Miami on Dec. 18. Frain averaged 43.4 yards in the final round, and his best hang time was 4.69 seconds. He out-performed Kyle Brindza, a senior who is ranked No. 1 in Kornblue Kicking's Fab 50 National Rankings and has committed to Notre Dame.

Senior Ollie Bauer, a wide receiver and safety, was named a Scholar Athlete by the Indiana National Football Foundation. The award is based on scholarship, citizenship and leadership as well as football performance.

"This award is considered by many coaches as the most prestigious high school football award," said Ott Hurrle, Scecina's head football coach. "Congratulations to Ollie on an award well deserved."

Bauer was previously named to the Indiana Football Coaches Association's All-State team and the All-City team this year after leading the team with 35 solo tackles and 40 assists, including 8 tackles for loss. Junior offensive lineman Mitch Singleton was another Crusader who made the All-State team with a 92 percent blocking percentage for the season.

Senior quarterback Jimmy Davis was nominated by Coach Hurrle as Scecina's Old Spice Player of the Year. Davis is now eligible for selection as a national Old Spice Player of the Year and if chosen would be honored in a full-page feature in USA Today. The award is given to a player who goes above and beyond the call of duty and embodies leadership, performance and desire while serving as an example for teammates on and off the field.

Davis was also named to the All-City team, along with seniors Ben Dugan, Luke Eichholtz and Garrett Young.

Scecina Memorial High School is a co-educational Catholic school on the east side of Indianapolis. The school, established in 1953, serves the East Deanery of the Archdiocese of Indianapolis.
