A Message from the Board of Directors Chair

Dear Friends of Scecina:

It's an exciting time at Scecina Memorial High School for many reasons. Under new leadership, Scecina continues to produce students of good character and quality while making changes to ensure our further success.

In October 2008, Joseph S. Therber became Scecina's fourth President. Mr. Therber has overseen the Limited Institutional Review of Scecina that was completed last spring. The LIR, an independent audit of Scecina to affirm existing strengths and identify opportunities for growth, will help Mr. Therber as he facilitates Scecina's improvement. Under the guidance of our new President, we will demonstrate why Scecina is the "Pride of the Eastside."

Scecina still excels at educating students in spirit, mind and body. Scecina students provide service to the Eastside community through the school's "Extras" Service Program. This past spring, the State of Indiana recognized Scecina's academic achievement, designating Scecina as a school of "Exemplary Status." The Class of 2009 earned over \$4,250,000 in college scholarships and grants. Significantly, 93% of Scecina students participated in extra-curricular activities, and student-athletes competed in 19 Indiana High School Athletic Association sanctioned sports. Scecina students are carrying on the tradition of "giving that little extra."

We continue to make progress in updating Scecina's facilities for 21st century educational needs. During the summer of 2008, Scecina refurbished four more classrooms and the hallways on all three levels of the school; reconfigured and renovated the school's administrative offices; installed a new ventilation system; and completed a state-of-the-art music facility. We will continue making similar improvements in accord with the Facilities Master Plan that the Scecina Board of Directors adopted several years ago.

Although this past year has been challenging, Scecina is blessed with considerable support. The Archdiocese of Indianapolis provided the grant that allowed us to complete the renovation work in our hallways, music center and main office. We are especially grateful for the support that Archbishop Daniel Buechlein has given us. The generosity of alumni and friends provided us with the means for accomplishing the classroom renovations, for which we also give our thanks. As we continue our goal of providing a Catholic education to students who seek assistance, we are certain to face even more challenges in the future, and pray that you will continue to support and pray for Scecina and its students.

I am honored to serve as Chair of Scecina's Board of Directors. Together, we will continue to carry out the vision of making Scecina the high school of choice for students who seek to grow in spirit, mind and body.

A Message from President

Joe Therber

Dear Friends of Scecina,

As you can see, your support directly affects our students and community in life-changing and far-reaching ways!

I would like to quote the spiritual leader of our Catholic Church in central and southern Indiana. Archbishop Daniel M. Buechlein, O. S. B., reflected this past summer on the vocation every one of us shares--the vocation to make a difference. The archbishop said:

“Each of us and all of us are called by God to make a difference in our world. Our response is an act of stewardship. We are stewards of the Church, and there are practical implications. All of us have our role as stewards of Christ’s mission.”

Your stewardship of the gifts that God has given you makes a specific, positive difference in our school. I thank you for your generosity, your support, your willingness to make a difference.

Year in Review

As the fourth person to be entrusted with the office of the President of this fine institution, I recently complete my first year in this role. During this time, our students, faculty, administrators, staff, and supporters have accomplished much. Please allow me to share a few highlights.

I wish to thank Archbishop Daniel and the archdiocesan administration for their undeniable support of Scecina. All one has to do is enter our school building or into conversation with the archbishop to grasp his commitment to Catholic education at 5000 Nowland Avenue.

The archbishop delegates certain leadership functions, such as overseeing financial matters and approving a future direction for the school, to the Board of Directors. Our Board, ably chaired during the past two years by Mr. Phil Kenney, deserves our gratitude for a job well done, especially during a period of leadership transition.

Speaking of financial matters, we are clearly experiencing the most challenging economic period of modern times. Yet our friends and alumni pledged more support to Scecina during the 2008-2009 fiscal year than was pledged during the year before. While vast numbers of charitable organizations saw declines in giving, we experienced the opposite, and I cannot thank you enough.

One of our first priorities last year was to engage our community in a Limited Institutional Review, or a snapshot of several essential aspects of school life. Through this process, we identified several strengths as well as areas for improvement, committed human and financial resources to improvement, and issued an executive summary report of conclusions and improvement goals to our community. The report is still available on our website at www.scecina.org.

Our mission statement says that we are a “Catholic, college preparatory school.” Alongside strategic planning and business management for which we as professionals and volunteers are responsible, our students gave us many shining examples of service and leadership last year. First, they donated more than 8,000 service hours to the community. Academically, the State of Indiana named Scecina an Exemplary School based on our ISTEP scores as well as our growth in scores over the prior year.

If it takes a village to raise a child, it also takes a village--students, teachers, educational administrators, parents, support staff, and benefactors--to attain these and more lofty accomplishments. We continued and developed our Literacy Services program that directly supports students who arrive at Seccina with special learning needs. Our number of AP (Advanced Placement) Scholars increased, as did the number of AP Test scores at the two highest passing levels.

We all know of the storied athletic tradition at Seccina Memorial High School. The 2008-2009 year was no exception, with Crusader teams winning Indiana Crossroads Conference championships in softball, girls basketball, and girls cross country; the baseball team playing in the City championship game, our boys and girls track and field teams placing multiple individuals in the IHSAA State Finals.

A True Friend of Seccina

As we were preparing this report the Seccina community experienced the loss of one of our greatest friends. On August 28, Mr. Philip J. Wilhelm's earthly life ended at the age of 67. Phil will rightly be remembered as one of our city's truly great leaders in the affairs of Church, community, business, and human relationships. While we will all truly miss Phil and his unique ways, we are also stronger because of him, both as individuals and as an institution. To give Phil's generosity toward Seccina the recognition that it deserves, we are planning a feature on Phil's life and impact in a future edition of this magazine.

Looking Forward

Looking forward, I see many reasons to be optimistic. Many faculty and administrators have remarked that the opening of the new school year was the best that they can remember. As an outcome of last year's plans, we are committing resources to many operational improvements such as our website, the professionalism of school events, developing a technology plan, exhibiting the utmost stewardship of our human and financial resources, expanding our Christian service program, researching school-day scheduling options, and re-activating the Crusader Student Ambassador organization that already includes 77 of our sophomores, juniors, and seniors.

On a strategic level, we are at the beginning stages of partnership discussions with higher educational institutions and civic organizations. We are researching what the next phase of facility improvements can and should be. Our students deserve exposure to opportunities in business and emerging industries outside day-to-day school life. At the invitation of Archbishop Daniel and the Office of Catholic Education, we are in discussion with several East Deanery parishes and elementary schools to explore how we can best sustain and expand our ministries through better sharing of people, programs, and places.

All in all, I cannot think of a better time to be involved at Seccina Memorial High School! Please stay involved and let us know what you are thinking.
