

LEARNING SUPPORT PROGRAM

Philosophy of the Program:

All students can succeed when provided the right atmosphere to meet their needs. It is the role of the teacher and the parent to provide an atmosphere that will assist all students in meeting and realizing their potential.

Qualification for the Program:

To qualify to participate in the program, a student will have been diagnosed with a learning difficulty and have an IEP, 504 or an ICEP.

Goal of the Program:

The goal is to assist all students who need additional support in their educational classes. Students who qualify for the Learning Support Program may be placed in a Study Skills class or on consultation. The Learning Support Coordinator will assist the classroom teachers to provide the accommodations defined by the student's IEP (Individual Education Plan). Through the Study Skills class the students have the opportunity to study, take tests, and complete assignments under the guidance, assistance, and supervision of the Learning Support Coordinator. Students are offered a peaceful and supportive environment in which they focus on their studies.
